

UNDERGRADUATE NURSING PROGRAMS OFFERED

- **Traditional daytime B.S.N.** — Designed for students seeking a baccalaureate degree and licensure as a Registered Nurse during traditional Monday-Friday daytime classes and clinical format. Cohorts for this program start each fall semester and full-time student status is required.
- **Traditional evening and weekend B.S.N.** — For students seeking a baccalaureate degree and licensure as a Registered Nurse designed around evening and weekend student availability. Classes are scheduled Monday-Friday starting at 5 p.m. with clinical rotations on the weekends. Cohorts for this program start each spring semester and full-time student status is required.
- **Accelerated B.S.N.** — An alternative program for students who already hold a bachelor's degree in a non-nursing subject and have completed all required prerequisites. This program condenses our B.S.N. curriculum into four intense consecutive semesters and is offered in person and online. Full-time student status is required. Online cohorts start each spring and fall semester and in-person cohorts start each spring semester only.

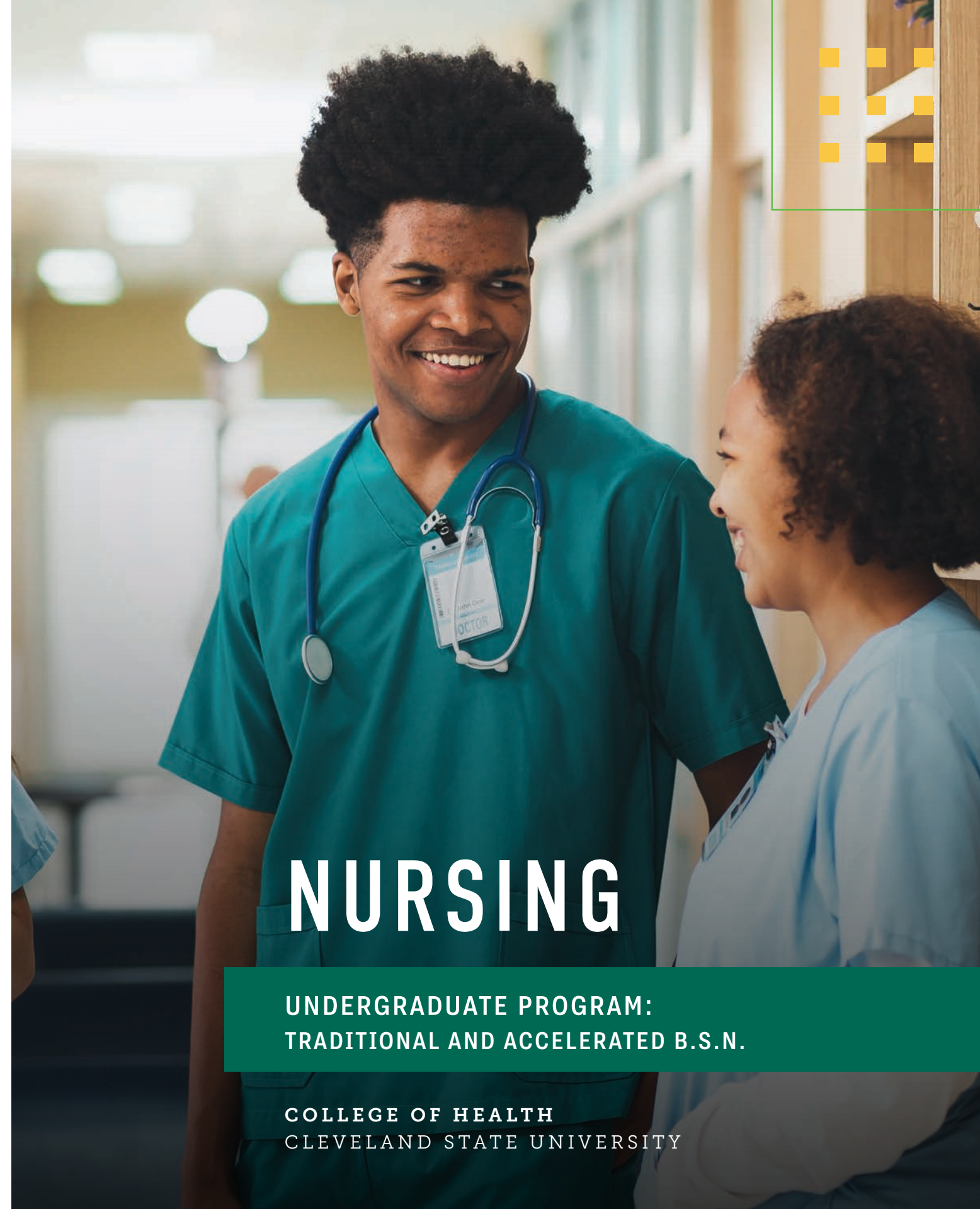

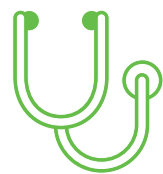

APPLY TO THE SCHOOL OF NURSING

Begin the admissions process by attending an information session. Contact the School of Nursing to make an appointment with an advisor.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION INCLUDE:

- Apply for admission to CSU as a pre-Nursing student. Submit your application at least six weeks prior to any School of Nursing deadlines.
- Complete all prerequisite coursework with a GPA of at least 3.0. At least two science courses must be completed at the time of application submission to the School of Nursing.*
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of at least **2.75 for traditional program** options and **2.5 for the accelerated program** option.
- Apply for admission to the School of Nursing before the below deadlines.
 - **Traditional daytime program (Fall start):** Jan. 1 for early decision* and March 1
 - **Traditional evening/weekend program (Spring start):** Sept. 1
 - **Accelerated program, in-person (Spring start):** June 1
 - **Accelerated program, online:** Sept. 1 (Spring start) or April 1 (Fall start)

Your application packet must include a School of Nursing application and fee, two School of Nursing recommendation forms, a current resume and official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended.

**Early decision requires a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or above and no prerequisite grades less than a B.*
