

MSN TERMINAL PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

By completing the MSN degree program at Cleveland State University, the graduate will:

- Integrate scientific findings from nursing, biopsychosocial fields, genetics, public health, quality improvement, and organizational sciences for the continual improvement of nursing care across diverse settings.
- Recognize that ethical and critical decision making are essential to designing and implementing organizational and systems leadership that promote high quality nursing education and safe patient care.
- 3. Use methods, tools, performance measures, and standards related to quality, as well as be prepared to apply quality principles within an organization.
- 4. Apply research outcomes within the practice setting to resolve practice problems, and by doing so, works as a change agent by disseminating results from research and practice improvement initiatives.
- 5. Use technologies to deliver and enhance care and nursing education.
- 6. Intervene at the system level through the policy development process and to employ advocacy strategies to influence health and health care.
- 7. Act as a member and leader of inter-professional teams by communicating, collaborating, and consulting with other health professionals to manage and coordinate care and nursing education.
- 8. Apply and integrate broad, organizational, client-centered, and culturally appropriate concepts in the planning, delivery, management, and evaluation of evidence-based clinical prevention and population care and services to individuals, families, and aggregates/identified populations.
- 9. Recognize that nursing practice is broadly defined as any form of nursing intervention that influences healthcare outcomes for individuals, populations, or systems; possess and integrate an advanced understanding of nursing and relevant sciences into direct and indirect practice components.
